Genealogy Corner

Family Tree Maker has been bought out by Mackiev, the company that has been producing the Mac version of the program for a number of years. They are currently working on updates that will enable PC users to continue to use all the features currently enjoyed by those who sync their trees with Ancestry.com. In order to be notified of these updates you need to go to Mackiev.com and register your email address with them so you receive notification of when the updates are available. In the future all purchases and program support will have to go through Mackiev so be sure to get on their list of users as quickly as possible.

Have you used the book search on Familysearch.org? These are books that have been digitized by several different organizations (Family History Library, Allen County Public Library, Midwest Genealogy Center, Houston Public Library and Clayton Library Center for Genealogical Research) but you have to search them yourself as they have not been indexed. I have found many county histories here. It's like going to the library and pulling the books off of the shelf. You can always try using the CTL F feature of many computers to search the contents of the book if you have a specific family name you hope to find.

http://www.convictrecords.com.au/ Approximately 160,000 convicts were transported to Australia between 1787 and 1867. Smith, Jones, William, Brown & Johnson round out the top 5 most common convict surnames with 1045 Johns(t)on(e)s currently listed on the website. This website allows you to search the British Convict transportation register for convicts transported to Australia between 1787-1867.

http://egenee.com/genealogy/genealogyform.html eGENEe is a catalog of genealogy and history websites which has

over 150,000 links for US websites. You can search by locality, years and categories, and the website details (free or fee).

<u>LDSGenealogy.com</u> - created to help people to find information about their ancestors. It includes many helpful articles for learning genealogy research and an extensive records directory to help you locate genealogical records.

https://familysearch.org/learningcenter/home.html - free online genealogy courses.

Tech Tips:

Asterisk (*) = When words might not appear next to each other the asterisk will hold a spot for a word or two between two words. This is very helpful when looking for items that might contain a name that includes a person's middle name or initial.

"David * Johnston" will result in in records containing David B. Johnston, David Benjamin Johnston, etc.

Numrange Search = 1790..1800 This will return results that contain dates within the range you have indicted.

Tent Hosting Committee:

Electronic Payments:



Famous Johnstons: Lieutenant John Vincent Johnston, USN

Summer is here and I don my well-worn USS Johnston DD 557 khaki cap in honor of the first of two destroyers commissioned "Johnston" (see S&P Winter 2005). "Was that your ship?" people often ask. No, I reply, but it *is* named for a family member. After all, he must be a relative somehow. Curiosity spurred me on to find out more about this Civil War hero, the namesake of both navy ships.

John Vincent Johnston, born in Cincinnati, joined the U.S. Navy at twelve years of age in 1838. Serving for ten years, he resigned to work the steamships on the Ohio and Mississippi Rivers. When the civil war began, there was a great demand for experienced brown-water sailors. He joined the United States Western Flotilla (army ships with navy crews) in 1861 as the executive officer of the ironclad St. Louis. His responsibilities as second-in-command included everything the captain of the vessel designated, including seeing to the welfare of the 251 men aboard.

These fourteen-gun ironclads were floating artillery platforms and gunnery was the most important skill on the ship. The western flotilla was charged with supporting the Union army with close fire and eliminating Confederate vessels and forts from the rivers. Johnston's days in the U.S. Navy had given him years

the ship.

of gunnery training and he brought these skills to the river. When firing, he was always with his gunners making sure the fire was accurate and timely. In March 1862, while firing on the Southern fort Island No. 10, his bow gun exploded resulting in paralysis in one arm. A brief two-week convalescence saw Johnston back on duty with the injured arm strapped to his chest.

Immediately upon his return, on the night of April 1, 1862 Johnston lead a landing party of forty sailors and fifty soldiers of the 42nd Illinois Infantry. Paddling in five bateau they landed near the first battery on Island No. 10 and spiked all seven guns withdrawing under fire but without losing a man. As a result of that action and prior exemplary service he was promoted to Acting Volunteer Lieutenant for gallantry.


After the fall of Vicksburg, Johnston was given his own command of tinclad No. 9, Forest Rose. The tinclads were rear-paddlewheel steamers, 155 feet long and armed with two 30-pound rifled guns and four 24-pound howitzers. The term 'tinclad' is really a misnomer in that most had no metal armor whatsoever; the armor consisted of wooden planks bolted around the ship on the decks to protect the crew from snipers on the riverbanks but were dangerous to the men from flying splinters when artillery ordnance hit

In February 1864 during a lull in action at Waterproof, LA, twenty miles above Baton Rouge, Johnston was joined by his wife and son on board. During the visit, the ship was alerted of a rebel attack on the town held by 250 black troops and their white officers. For three days the Forest Rose laid down withering fire steaming up and down the river. Finally, the rebel force grew to five regiments, some 5000 men who were driving cattle to Georgia to reinforce Confederate General Joseph E. Johnston and had to cross the river at Waterproof. The heaviest fighting saw the

Confederates unlimber horse artillery and shoot it out with the Forest Rose.



On the third day of battle, the army commander of Waterproof asked to be evacuated for the third time as his little force was massively outnumbered. Johnston complied. For that action, Johnston was lauded by him in his report, that never had he seen more accurate fire when requested, resulting in the safety of his command.

In 1864, LT Johnston became very ill, resigned his commission, and lived in Caldwell Parrish, LA until 1870 when he moved back to Cincinnati. He continued to skipper riverboats and in 1883 he was finally granted a federal pension for his service and

sacrifice. By 1890 he was living in St. Louis, a destitute widower. Son Jimmy died in 1900 and John followed in 1912.

Thirty-one years later Commander Ernest Evans, Medal of Honor, stood at the pier as the brand new USS Johnston was commissioned in the fall of 1943. He evoked the fighting spirit of LT John Johnston, master gunner of the Mississippi when he said, "I intend to go into harm's way....I have a fighting ship and I will never retreat from an enemy force." Johnston died largely unnoticed but the navy never forgot his valor, leadership and deadly accuracy with naval artillery. In recognition of his sacrifice, they commissioned two destroyers in his honor.

Lord David Patrick Wentworth Hope Johnstone

Lord David Johnstone is the son of our Chief, Lord Patrick Andrew Wentworth Hope Johnstone of Annandale. In 1985, the Johnstone Chiefship and the earldoms of Annandale and Hartfell were confirmed upon Patrick Johnstone of Annandale and of that Ilk. Lord Patrick is now the 11th Earl of Annandale and Hartfell and the present Clan Chief. Lord David is representing Chief Patrick at the AGM.

Lord David took over running of the family business in Scotland in 2000 and has managed it ever since. The business is comprised of land-based activities from stalking, shooting and fishing, and also includes forestry, commercial and residential property with some tourist accommodation. Lord David has helped diversify the business into renewables. Three hydro schemes, a biomass and wind farm are under construction. The business also sports carriage driving, horse cross country, and a small music festival.

Lord David was educated in Aysgarth, then Stowe School and earned a degree in Economics and Geology from the University of St. Andrew.

Since 2014, Lord David has chaired the Scottish Land and Estates, representing all landowners in Scotland. He also chairs the development of trusts of Moffat and Johnstonbridge; and serves as the Director of the Dumfries and Galloway Housing Trust.

Lord David has three children and enjoys shooting, golf, tennis and squash.


